Directive 2009/28/EC

- Directive 2009/28/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 April 2009 on the promotion of the use of energy from renewable sources and amending and subsequently repealing Directive 2001/77/EC and 2003/30/EC
- => OJ, 5 June 2009, L 140/6
- => Art 175 (1) EC Treaty
- => Art 95 EC Treaty (articles 17, 18, 19)
- => MS transposition by 5 December 2010



Directive 2009/28/EC

- Commission Decision 2009/548/EC of 30 June 2009 establishing a template for National Renewable Energy Action Plans under Directive 2009/28/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council, OJ, 15 July 2009, L 182/33
