Formed in 1993 after a merger between Glasgow Polytechnic and Queens College, Glasgow Caledonian has grown into Scotlands fourth largest university catering for over 15,000 students. The University offers undergraduate, post-graduate and part-time degrees spread across seven academic schools in the areas of business, health and science and technology. Glasgow Caledonian can boast a rate of 92% of graduates finding work within six months of graduating.

The campus is located just north of Glasgow city centre. A modern facility, the campus includes the newly built "Saltire Centre" which houses the university library, student mall, study areas for up to 1,800 students and exhibition space for showcasing student work. Other facilities consist of the "Arc" health and fitness centre, a virtual hospital, a clinical simulation centre and modern broadcasting suites.
